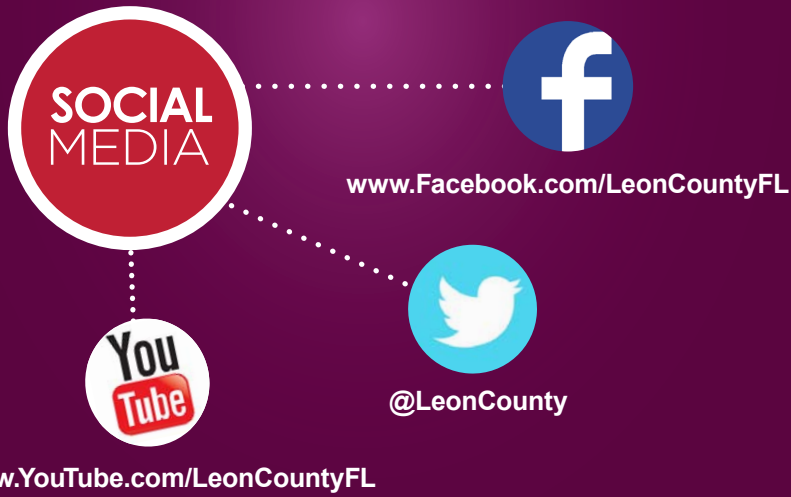

INTERESTED IN SERVING ON A CITIZEN ADVISORY COMMITTEE?

Citizen participation, by way of community input, advice and/or recommendations regarding matters brought before the Board of County Commissioners for approval, is important in developing Leon County's programs/policies and in providing quality public services to the community.

Currently, applications are being accepted for the following Leon County Committee vacancies:

- **Affordable Housing Advisory Committee (AHAC)** – The goal of AHAC is to identify incentives that are pertinent to affordable housing and serve as an information resource to help improve affordable housing feasibility. **Three** vacancies in the following categories:
 1. A member who represents employers within the jurisdiction.
 2. A member who is actively engaged in the banking or mortgage banking industry in connection with affordable housing.
 3. A member who represents essential services personnel, as defined in the local housing assistance plan.
- **Joint City/County/School Board Coordinating Committee** – The purpose of this committee is to foster the coordination of comprehensive planning and school facilities planning programs by addressing concurrency issues.

Leon County citizens may visit www.LeonCountyFL.gov/Committees to review a listing of committees that includes information on committee responsibilities, member eligibility, and committee vacancies; complete a committee application; and review the Citizen Committee Orientation and Training.

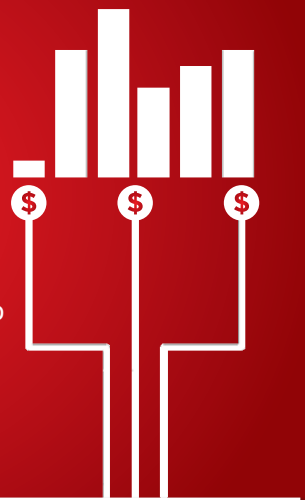

Leon County Government will now serve citizens faster and more easily with an online procurement system called **Procurement Connect**. This new system will provide vendors instant access to many different services and processes that would otherwise need to be completed on paper or in different online applications. Leon County's **Procurement Connect** creates a one-stop shop for solicitations and is provided at no charge to vendors and the public.

Procurement Connect not only lowers processing time and increases accuracy, but it also strengthens the County's commitment to sustainable practices. Some of the many services include instant access to bids, requests for proposal, invitations to negotiate, and various other solicitation documents such as planholder lists, tabulation sheets, solicitation meeting attendance, intended awards and public meeting notices.
