## Night of Broken Glass

### Leon County Recognizes the 75th Anniversary of Kristallnacht, or "Night of Broken Glass"

Through a \$10,000 donation by Raymond and Grant Capelouto, Leon County Government will make available a variety of Holocaust-related educational materials through the LeRoy Collins Leon County Public Library System.

Leon County, the Capelouto family and the Holocaust Education Resource Council will also recognize the 75th anniversary of Kristallnacht. Often called the "Night of Broken Glass," Kristallnacht was a series of coordinated attacks against Jews throughout Nazi Germany and parts of Austria in 1938.

In partnership with the Holocaust Education Resource Council, Leon County will host a program about Kristallnacht on **Thursday, November 7, 2013 at 7 p.m.** in the Main Library (downtown), 200 West Park Ave. Raymond and Grant Capelouto will welcome attendees on behalf of the Capelouto family. Mike Olivella, photographer of Auschwitz, will also speak and display his photographs. At this event, the first 75 items purchased with the donation will be displayed and offered for checkout by citizens. After the program, the materials will remain on display for library patrons to review and checkout.



## Adopt-A-Tree

Leon County is proud to offer the 2014 Adopt-A-Tree public tree planting program. If you live inside Leon County, but outside of Tallahassee city limits, you may qualify to have a Basswood planted on your property for free. If you are looking for a medium to large sized shade tree, this is certainly one to consider. Also known as American linden, this tree can be grown as a specimen or shade tree.



If you agree to water the tree three times a week for one year, Leon County Public Works will plant the tree anywhere between your house and any publicly-maintained road or any privately maintained road with public access. To have a tree planted on your property between February and March 2014, simply fill out an application online at [www.LeonCountyFL.gov/AdoptATree](http://www.LeonCountyFL.gov/AdoptATree) and place a wooden stake at the desired location. Public Works will try to get as close to the designated area as possible. One tree per household per year will be planted.

The application deadline is **Friday, January 31, 2014**.
