## **Report and Discussion**

## **Background:**

This item requests the Board's waiver, pursuant to Section 112.313(12), Florida Statutes, of the conflicting business relationships of certain stakeholder members appointed to the Tallahassee-Leon County Affordable Housing Workgroup as shown in their corresponding disclosure forms (Attachments #1-8).

On October 27, 2016 the County and City Commissions held a joint affordable housing workshop and approved the creation of the Tallahassee-Leon County Affordable Housing Workgroup ("Workgroup"), and tasked them to develop a plan for the redevelopment of a multi-family housing unit with a report to be provided to the Commission within 150 days. The Workgroup was established to comprise local stakeholders including representatives from various non-profit affordable housing providers, affordable housing consumers, affordable housing developers, and local government. At its regular meeting on November 22, 2016, the Board ratified the action taken at the joint workshop and adopted Resolution No. 16-37 to establish the Workgroup and set forth its membership, goals, and duties (Attachment #9).

In addition to staff representatives from County Housing, City Housing, and Leon County Schools, and an affordable housing consumer and an affordable housing developer appointed by each of the County and City Commissions, the Workgroup membership is composed of representatives from the following organizations:

- Leon County Housing Finance Authority
- Tallahassee Housing Authority
- Beatitude Foundation
- Tallahassee Lenders' Consortium
- Big Bend Continuum of Care
- Big Bend Homeless Coalition
- Ability 1<sup>st</sup>
- Bethel Community Development Corporation
- Habitat for Humanity of the Big Bend
- Tallahassee Urban League

The first meeting of the Workgroup was held on January 31, 2017, at which time the individual representatives of each of the stakeholder entities were first identified. Upon determining whether a member's relationship with their respective stakeholder entity, or with any other associated business entity, resulted in one of the statutory conflicts explained below, they were requested to provide a disclosure form for presentment to the County and/or City Commissions.

## Analysis:

Conflicts of interest among the Workgroup members may exist due to a member having or holding an employment or a conflicting contractual relationship with a business entity doing business with the County and/or City. This type of potential conflict is addressed in Section 112.313, Florida Statutes, entitled Standards of Conduct for Public Officers ("Code of Ethics"). The Code of Ethics also provides several exemptions under which a person is deemed not to

have a conflict in violation of the Code of Ethics and a provision under which these conflicts can be waived by the County and City Commissions.

To protect against this type of potential conflict, the Code of Ethics prohibits a Workgroup member from having or holding any employment or contractual relationship with a business entity or agency under any of the following circumstances:

- The business entity or agency is doing business with the County or City; or
- The employment or contractual relationship will:
  - create a continuing or frequently recurring conflict between the Workgroup member's private interests and the performance of his or her duties as a member of the Workgroup, or
  - impede the full and faithful discharge of the Workgroup member's duties as a member of the Workgroup.

Under these circumstances, a potential conflict results for any Workgroup member who has an employment or contractual relationship with any stakeholder entity that does business with the County and/or City. However, for those stakeholder representatives who have an uncompensated business relationship with a non-profit stakeholder entity, the Code of Ethics provides an exemption from conflicts arising under a conflicting employment or contractual relationship.

If none of the statutory exemptions are applicable to the conflict arising from the Workgroup member's association with a business entity, the Code of Ethics contains a waiver provision that would allow that person to serve on the Workgroup. The County and City Commissions can waive such a conflict upon the satisfaction of the following two requirements:

- a full disclosure to the Commissions, prior to the waiver, of the transaction or business relationship from which the conflict arises; and
- an affirmative vote in favor of the waiver by a two-thirds vote of the respective County and/or City Commissions.

Upon the Board's consideration of the applicable disclosure forms of those Workgroup members with conflicts, staff recommends that the Board waive such conflicts. Each waiver, by statute, will require at least a two-thirds vote which the Board can collectively approve.

## **Options:**

- 1. Approve collectively, by at least a two-thirds vote, the waivers to allow certain stakeholder individuals to serve on the Tallahassee-Leon County Affordable Housing Workgroup as shown in their corresponding disclosure forms (Attachments #1-8).
- 2. Do not approve the waivers to allow certain stakeholder individuals to serve on the Tallahassee-Leon County Affordable Housing Workgroup as shown in their corresponding disclosure forms (Attachments #1-8).
- 3. Board direction.

## A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEON COUNTY, FLORIDA TO ESTABLISH AN ADVISORY COMMITTEE WHICH SHALL BE NAMED TALLAHASSEE-LEON COUNTY AFFORDABLE HOUSING WORKGROUP.

WHEREAS, Access to safe, affordable housing is a critical element when measuring the quality of life and economic vitality of communities in Tallahassee/Leon County; and

WHEREAS, while affordable housing initiatives are evident in several regions of the county, the on-going success and continued need for these programs is exemplified by existing waiting lists across the current programs, demonstrating the need for a greater collaborative effort amongst community stakeholders in order to address the need for affordable housing; and

WHEREAS, on October 27, 2016 the Board of County Commissioners of Leon County, Florida (the "Board") and the City of Tallahassee Commission (the "Commission") held a joint affordable housing workshop to explore utilizing new and existing opportunities for collaboration through the exploration of best practices, innovative ideas, fund leveraging and a host of other resources and strategies to realize the revitalization and creation of affordable housing communities; and

WHEREAS, the Board and the Commission recognizes and acknowledges the importance of engaging local stakeholders to address the needs for affordable housing in the community; and

WHEREAS, in order to consider the input of the public in the matter of affordable housing opportunities and need in the community, the Board and Commission wish to establish and appoint an advisory committee to function and operate in accordance with Board Policy No. 03-15, "Board-Appointed Advisory Committees: Establishment, Appointment, Function,

Operation, and Dissolution" ("Board-Appointed Advisory Committees").

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF LEON COUNTY, that:

1. The Board hereby establishes an advisory committee, to be named the Tallahassee-Leon

County Affordable Housing Workgroup (the "Committee"), for the purpose of the collaboration and coordination of addressing affordable housing resources in the community.

- 2. The Committee shall function and operate as a Decision Making Committee in accordance with Board Policy No. 03-15, "Board-Appointed Advisory Committees."
- 3. The Committee shall have seventeen (17) members comprised of one representative

each of the following:

- 1) The Leon County Housing Finance Authority
- 2) Tallahassee Housing Authority
- 3) Beatitude Foundation
- 4) Tallahassee Lenders' Consortium
- 5) Big Bend Continuum of Care
- 6) Big Bend Homeless Coalition
- 7) Ability 1st
- 8) Bethel Community Development Corporation
- 9) Habitat for Humanity of the Big Bend
- 10) Tallahassee Urban League
- 11) Leon County Schools
- 12) Leon County Housing Services staff
- 13) City of Tallahassee Housing Services staff
- 14) An affordable housing consumer appointed by the City Commission
- 15) An affordable housing consumer appointed by the County Commission
- 16) An affordable housing developer appointed by the City Commission
- 17) An affordable housing developer appointed by the County Commission
- 4. The Committee shall have as its goal to develop a plan for the redevelopment of a

multi-family housing unit that provides the following:

- Recommendations for the coordination and collaboration of local government, non-profit and for-profit resources.
- A housing design that considers the needs of residents and enhances the overall community.
- Recommendations for leveraging the financial resources of local, state and federal resources to address permanent support housing for the homeless population.
- Consider engaging organizations that promote best practices in affordable housing models.
- 5) Recommendations for a structure that would sustain the collaborative efforts of the Affordable Housing Workgroup.
- 5. The Committee shall provide an written report to the Board and the Commission within 150 days of its execution.
- 6. The Committee shall be dissolved after 150 days or no later than June 30, 2017.
- The Committee shall be staffed by Leon County Housing Services Division and the City of Tallahassee Community Housing and Human Services.
