Library System, Second Harvest Partner Against Hunger

This month, Leon County is partnering with America's Second Harvest of the Big Bend to recognize September as Hunger Action Month. This is part of a nationwide effort to raise awareness for the fight against hunger.

Locally, Second Harvest has experienced a significant increase in the number of individuals and families seeking food assistance. Overall, the organization has seen a 46-percent increase in requests for assistance in the past year, mainly attributed to the current economic downturn that has impacted the local economy.

In order to assist in raising awareness of Hunger Action Month, drop-off bins will be placed at the LeRoy Collins Leon County Public Library System's Main Library and Fort Braden branch beginning Tuesday, Sept. 8, so that residents may donate non-perishable foods.

"One in eight Americans – including people in the Big Bend – are struggling with hunger, and Hunger Action Month is an opportunity for us to raise awareness of the issue of hunger and ways people can help," said Cheryl Phoenix, Executive Director of the America's Second Harvest of the Big Bend.

America's Second Harvest is the nation's leading domestic hunger-relief charity, providing food to 25 million Americans each year, including 9 million children and 3 million senior citizens.

year's observance, according to the Alliance for Rabies Control, a United Kingdom charity that helped spearhead the effort with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. The group expects to exceed that number this year.
