Leon County Offers Local Youth the **Opportunity for Summer Employment** Summer Youth Training Program 2010

Summer is a time when most students look forward to enjoying a vacation, but for some, summer is a good time to explore career opportunities. The Leon County Summer Youth Training Program is designed to allow students to do just that. This six-week program introduces participants to the workplace, imparts valuable employment skills, and provides a summer income for Leon County youth between the ages of 14 and 21. Applications are due Friday, May 7.

There are 59 positions available, all for 20 to 25 hours per week and pay \$7.25 per hour. Summer youth workers have the opportunity to gain experience in a variety of locations throughout Leon County including Public Works, EMS, Parks & Recreation and several others. The 2010 Summer Youth Training Program is scheduled to run from June 14, through July 22.

Creating a better tomorrow through learning Leon County to Host Sustainable Communities Summit in May

Building on its efforts from the 2008 Climate Action Summit, the Leon County Board of County Commissioners will be hosting the Leon County Sustainable Communities Summit 2010 on May 6 and 7 to educate and engage Leon County residents and businesses on the necessity of developing a sustainable community.

The summit aims to provide individuals the tools necessary to translate interest into action. The event will be meaningful for everyone - curious beginners and seasoned professionals alike, especially citizens interested in what they can personally do to strengthen their community. The 2-day event will include 30 breakout sessions allowing attendees to delve into the "nuts and bolts" of a sustainable economy and food systems. Attendees will include consultants, independent produce growers, small and mid-sized businesses, entrepreneurs and representatives from civic groups, government and the education sector.

Presentations and workshops will focus on fostering a sustainable economy and the importance of sustainable food systems. Attendees will learn where to buy locally produced food; meet some of the farmers responsible for those fruits, vegetables, eggs and meat; how to take a garden to the next level and sell produce; and better market their existing farm. Learn how a business can operate more sustainably even if they are not a "green" service provider; find new markets to expand an existing business; locate financial, business or marketing resources; and explore the importance of shopping and investing locally. The summit will address two target audiences: the producer of a local good or service and the consumer. Attendees will benefit from an accelerated educational and networking opportunity.

The summit, coordinated by the Leon County Office of Sustainability, will be held at the newly constructed Florida State University Turnbull Center, a state-of-the-art facility built to LEED Silver standards.
