EMS 10 Year Celebration Anniversary



On Tuesday, December 10, 2013, Leon County Government, along with many members of the local, regional, and state medical community, recognized the men and women of the nationally accredited Leon County Emergency Medical Services (EMS) for ten years of service, excellence, and innovation in this community. Hosted in the Leon County EMS Operations Center, the celebration ceremony featured Leon County leadership, patients saved by excellent care, and many of the EMS team members, 33 in total, who served from the first call on December 31, 2003. Since that first call, Leon County EMS has responded to more than 300,000 requests for assistance.

Adopt-A-Tree

Leon County is proud to offer the 2014 Adopt-A-Tree public tree planting program. If you live inside Leon County, but outside of Tallahassee city limits, you may qualify to have a Basswood planted on your property for free. If you are looking for a medium to large sized shade tree, this is certainly one to consider. Also known as American linden, this tree can be grown as a specimen or shade tree.



If you agree to water the tree three times a week for one year, Leon County Public Works will plant the tree anywhere between your house and any publicly-maintained road or any privately maintained road with public access. To have a tree planted on your property between February and March 2014, simply fill out an application online at www.LeonCountyFL.gov/AdoptATree and place a wooden stake at the desired location. Public Works will try to get as close to the designated area as possible. One tree per household per year will be planted
